**Sign on Fence:** Salesmen welcome! Dog food is expensive.

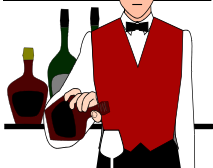
**Sign in Cafeteria:** Shoes are required to eat in the cafeteria. Socks can eat any place they want.

Relief - what trees do in the spring (Re-leaf)

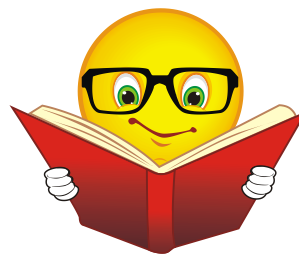
Polarize - What penguins see with. (Polar eyes)
